This year Barnsbury are working closely with the <u>Bee - lieve Foundation</u> on the <u>'Make a Difference for Molly Project'.</u>

At the Bee-lieve Foundation, based in NW Surrey, we convert the generosity of donors and the passion of our applicants into evidence-based programmes that build and sustain positive emotional wellbeing and mental health in UK schools. It's a complicated world to be young in.

Molly lived in Woking. She was adventurous, full of love for the people around her, and had a wonderful sense of humour. She had a big heart and a way of making others feel included and valued. But behind her bright exterior, she struggled with her mental health for many years.

When Molly took her own life at the age of 21, it was an unimaginable loss for her family and friends. Molly's story is at the heart of everything we do at Bee-Lieve as she reminds us daily why compassion, connection, and open conversations about mental health truly matter. The Molly project is a schools-based initiative, designed to support children and young people with their emotional wellbeing, resilience, and self-belief. Bee - lieve work with schools and communities to:

· Build resilience – giving children the tools to manage stress, setbacks, and change.

· Grow confidence — helping young people believe in themselves and their abilities.

· Support wellbeing - normalising conversations about mental health and teaching practical strategies to stay well.

· Create safe spaces – ensuring every child knows they are not alone, and that support is always within

reach.

It is our way of honouring her life. It's about turning pain into purpose, and making sure other families don't have to experience the same heartbreak.

As a school Barnsbury are benefitting from the support of this charity through extra training and some new well being initiatives that will support our children alongside our ELSA and other already established programmes. It is also promoting the transition from Primary to Secondary and giving us the opportunity to work with our local secondary schools around continuing to support the well being our of our young people.

This year there will be collections at the Key Stage 1 and Early Years Christmas performances as well as the donations of £1 on Christmas Jumper day to help support this charity. Every step we take, every conversation we hold, every bit of advice we share, will be done to keep Molly's memory burning brightly and to build a positive legacy out of such a tragic loss. We all have mental health and our emotional wellbeing needs to be nurtured, cared for and developed like our physical health.
