

Year 6 Curriculum Planner Autumn 2025

English

Writing – narrative (including portal stories) that include ambitious and adventurous vocabulary. Opportunities to write diaries and speeches. Explore poems and write our own inspired by a variety of poets.

Grammar – to use a variety of sentences that include connectives, commas, brackets, dashes and modal verbs.

Reading – locate information by skimming and scanning. Use prediction and inference skills.

Maths

Place value – read, write, order and round numbers to 10 000 000, determining the value of each digit.

Number operations - Revise formal methods for addition, subtraction and multiplication. Introduce formal long division.

Fractions - order and compare. Add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions.

Position & Direction – Translation, reflection and co-ordinates in 4 quadrants.

Science

Living things – classifying and discovering how animals and plants adapt to their habitats.

Evolution and inheritance - to understand that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents.

Art

Create self -portraits using line, shape, colour and texture.

<u>DT</u>

Textiles – following a brief to create a product.

RE

Islam – where and how Muslims worship.

Christianity – how churches serve local and global communities.

Computing

Online safety and understand what a variable is within a program.

French

To create different questions and statements. Use verbs and adjectives to describe people.

Music

Describe, compare and evaluate music from a variety of genres. Compose a variety of melodic and rhythmic phrases.

<u>PSHE</u>

Understand basic human rights and children's rights in the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of the Child. To understand the consequences of anti-social behaviour such as bullying and discrimination.

Geography

Life in hot desert environments. Pupils will learn about where deserts are found, what makes them unique, and how people live and work in places like the Mojave Desert. They'll think about the challenges and benefits of desert life, and compare it to other environments.

History

How Maharaja Ranjit Singh brought different groups together to form a strong and fair empire. Pupils will explore key events, important people, and how the empire helped shape history.
