

Year 4 Curriculum Planner Summer 2025

English

Writing:

Poetry: Explore musicality, rhythm and rhyme.

Fiction: Narratives.

Non-fiction – explanation texts, note of advice,

report writing.

Grammar – Expanded noun phrases, plural and possessive -s, fronted adverbials, use paragraphs, inverted commas, apostrophes

Reading – Using predictions and inference skills and evaluating texts.

Maths

Measurement – convert between pounds and pence, compare and calculate with money, convert between analogue and digital times, convert to the 24-hour clock

Geometry – angles, triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons, symmetry, draw 2-D shapes on a grid, translate on a grid, plot coordinates

Science

Living Things and their Habitat:

Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways.

Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment.

Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

To explore existing greenhouses and investigate stable structures.

To understand the importance of rainforests to the global environment and why they are under threat.
