
Please ensure your children wear school shoes and not trainers.



Phonics



Read, Write Inc is a daily phonics session where we practise the letter sounds and read from a book targeted at your child's current phonics level. These will be separate books from the ones sent home.

We use rhymes to teach the letter sounds. These are in your child's reading diary.



The phonics screening check or phonics screener is administered in the summer term across all schools in the UK. It is a statutory assessment.

The purpose of the check is to assess children's recognition of the phonics/sounds they have learnt so far.

The check is administered with the class teacher, one child at a time in a quiet, familiar room.

What happens?

- ► Takes between 4 and 9 minutes to complete
- Consists of 40 words (alien/nonsense words mixed with real words)
- Features words of 3 or 4 letters and words of 5 or 6 letters
- Presented in a child friendly way e.g alien character pictures for 'alien words'
- ▶ Will take place the week beginning the 10th June

The Phonics Screening Check is designed to

- show how well a child can use their phonic skills
- · identify pupils who need extra phonic help

All pupils in year 1 will take the check during the week

- Your child will be scored against a national standard,
- In 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 the "pass threshold" was 32, which means children had to read at least 32 words out of 40 correctly. The threshold mark is communicated to schools at the end of June, after the test has been taken.
- You will be told how your child did within their school report at the end of the year, but schools' results will not be published. If your child's score falls below the standard, they will be given extra phonics help and can re-take the Phonics Screening Check in Year 2.
- ▶ Please do not ask your child's teacher on the week of the screening how they have done, unfortunately we are not allowed to tell you ©

Please remember:

- For the children it will just be a normal day at school. We do not refer to it as a 'test' or 'exam'.
- They are not being asked to do something they haven't done before, phonics lessons since reception have always included reading 'real/alien' words.
- ► They can only do their best ©
- ▶ If they need more support with phonics they will have already had plenty of help and interventions in place and this will have been communicated with you at parents evenings etc.

preparations:

- Your child could take the check at any day on the given week so please ensure they are well rested, and have eaten a good breakfast
- ► Keep reading with them as normal 5x a week and practising any sounds that they need support with.
- If you have any questions do not hesitate to chat with your class teacher
- ► Thank you for your continued support



Reading



- Read daily
- Record reading in their Reading Diary
- Please praise effort and having a try at sounding out unfamiliar words
- Red words are words that can't be sounded out phonetically.
 These need to be learned by sight reading. A copy of these are in the back of your child's diary.
- Please support your child in understanding what they have read by asking questions about the story. This will need to be secure before they move up reading levels.

Reading Diaries will only be checked on a Friday.


Reminder:
