A typical day


AM:

English





Daily English lessons based around a new story each half term. CLPE scheme. We reveal each part of the story slowly, looking in greater depth at the themes of the book. This opens lots of exciting writing opportunities for the children inc letters, instructions, setting descriptions etc.

Phonics



The majority of children will continue with daily phonics lessons. They are assessed each half term and put into carefully matched groups that help them to develop their reading and comprehension skills. The children will bring home a RWI coloured book from their group with a corresponding 'book banded' reading book.

We follow the Read Write Inc Phonics and spelling programmes.

Reading at home:

- Reading please continue to read 5 times per week with your child. Reading diaries include a phonics sound chart.
- From Friday your child will come home with a RWI phonics book, a letter will be sent out about this. Please provide an A4 plastic folder

The areas covered in Year 2:

- Number and place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and division (2's 3's 5's and 10's, making connections)
- Fractions (write simple fractions and recognise equivalence.)
- Measurement
- Property of shapes
- Position and direction
- Statistics (e.g tally's and tables)

Homework:



- All homework handed out on Wednesday and collected in on the following Wednesday. This will be posted on SeeSaw. We will store this in their plastic wallet.
- Homework will commence after the October half term to allow the children to settle. We will share more details after this.

Children to arrive in PE kit on Thursdays and Fridays

- We will check reading diaries once a week. In their reading diary you can find information about phonics sounds they may be working on and the library book they have bought home as well as login details for homework.

- Please do not walk through the school's car parks but use the footpath around the side of the car park to enter the school building and school playgrounds.

Reminders:




Keep everyone safe—drive slowly around the estate.

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium funding from the government is given to schools to help pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for pupils who:

Are registered for free school meals

Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years

Are, or have been, in care or

Have parents in the armed forces.

At Barnsbury Primary School and Nursery, we get an extra £1,320 for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we offer.

This year our Pupil Premium money has helped with:

Learning assistants to work with individuals and small groups.

Specific intervention support groups for pupils — Explore learning, Lexia, Easimaths, Third Space

Part payments for families for school visits, clubs and activities

ELSA support in school for children with emotional needs
