### Year 3




Year 3 children have returned from their summer holidays eager to learn and do their best. Everyone has settled back really well and they are making us proud everyday.

This year, we are increasing our time learning outdoors. So far, the children have taken part in outdoor activities in Maths, English and History, using the playground as a classroom. In Maths, we played games to build our understanding of place value and number. In English, we focused on discovering what makes a sentence.

In Art, we are looking at architecture and famous architects. We discovered that Christopher Wren designed St Paul's Cathedral. We learnt about shading and how we can create different shading effects by using our pencil in a different way.





### Year 1

We have been enjoying outside maths, sorting lots of different things into groups. We have also looked at counting forwards and backwards, one more than and one less than.



We have been learning about herbivores and carnivores, as well as habitats including the Savannah and Antarctica. The children loved watching nature clips of their favourite animals, and finding these places on Google Earth! We are creating a 'zoo' with all of our learning about each animals. The children have looked at classifying mammals and birds so far!



We have had a fabulous start to the year in Year One. We have been learning about the 'Earth our Home.' We have made hippo houses, penguins from play dough and learned all about carnivores, herbivores, mammals and birds. We have had lots of fun comparing numbers in maths.



### Year 4

Madame Kidd had some exciting news to share with the Year 4 children this week!

Our school and The Woking Town Twinning Association, teams up with Henri Wallon School in Le Plessis Robinson - France, to correspond and learn more about the children in Year 4 at their school. A wonderful opportunity for both to grow and develop in their language.

In maths, we have enjoyed being outside and getting active when solving problems with place value. All the children have been showing their Barnsbury values to persevere when solving tricky concepts using resources to see challenges through to the end....with great success!

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
